THE GAUTENG PROVINCIAL OFFICE HOSTED THEIR STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT SESSION FOR THE 2022/23 FINANCIAL YEAR

The Gauteng leg of the provincial stakeholder engagements was hosted by the provincial team led by their Provincial Manager, Ms Mapule Phora, under the theme: '*Tackle unemployment through economic recovery*'.

The three-day stakeholder engagement was very insightful and informative with robust discussions amongst various stakeholders who were very keen and enthusiastic to form tangible partnerships for the betterment of Gauteng communities. Stakeholders who attended the session include Gauteng Premier's Office, West Rand Mayor's Office, Department of Education, Social Services (City of Johannesburg), NEDLAC, the Department of Economic Development, Department of Social Development (DSD) and South African Social SALGA, National Security Agency (SASSA). Lotteries Commission (NLC), ASSUPOL, NYDA, the Gauteng Department of Agriculture and Rural Development, as well as Wheels of Change joined the session on the second day.

In line with Minister Lindiwe Zulu's request for the three government entities to work together in a portfolio approach, it was key to have the DSD as well as SASSA on board to be able to assist the provincial office to yield their set goals for the 2022/23 Financial Year.

Ms Phora informed delegates that before COVID-19 the President of the Republic of South Africa President Ramaphosa launched the District Development Model (DDM) in Limpopo, Kwa-Zulu Natal and the Eastern Cape. This Model brings all spheres of government together with other social partners in every district to grow inclusive local

The plans are to pilot the DDM in the West Rand Region in this Financial Year and that will inform how they have to duplicate it in the other five regions in the next Financial Year, namely City of Johannesburg, City of Tshwane, Ekurhuleni, organisations to help alleviate pressure from an already challenged society.
