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#### **OVERVIEW OF NDA**

The National development Agency is a public entity listed under Schedule 3A of the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA). It was established in terms of the National Development Agency Act No 108 of 1998 as amended.

#### Our mandate

In terms of the National Development Agency (NDA) Act (Act No 108 of 1998 as amended), NDA was mandated to contribute towards the eradication of poverty and its causes by granting funds to civil society organizations (CSOs) to:

- Implement development projects in poor communities, and
- Strengthen the institutional capacity of other CSOs that provide services to poor communities.

Facilitate sustainable development by strengthening civil society organizations involved in poverty eradication through enhanced grant funding and research.

#### 1. BACKGROUND

The National Development Agency (NDA) is a public entity entrusted with the mandate to contribute towards eradication of poverty and its causes by providing financial and non-financial assistance to Civil Society Organizations (CSO) involved in direct service provision to poor communities throughout South Africa.

The NDA currently has an office in each of the nine (9) provinces and Six (6) District Offices, with the head office in Parktown where the datacentre is located. The NDA's ICT is centralised but provides support to all NDA offices nationally. One of the major requirements of the NDA's ICT is the availability of Internet services and interconnectivity of offices for information sharing.

The current solution deployed at NDA offers a fully converged Multiprotocol Label Switching (MPLS) network, connecting seven sites including the head office. The MPLS network allows each site to be connected directly into the Current Service Provider's (CSP) Telecom network and deliver services from the core network to the respective branches.

The solution should provide consolidated internet access into one central location. Centralising Internet connectivity will enable the NDA to have greater control of its security policy as it can be administered easily and effectively.

The NDA currently has seven offices (Head Office and 6 Provincial Offices) which are all connected by an MPLS network through Fibre and/or Diginet WAN Links. We use Cisco routers (owned and managed by Network Service Providers).

The NDA owns the full POE fortiGATE switches (224D) that support fibre uplink and a centralised Fortinet firewall 500D hosted at the current service provider's premises. In addition the NDA has, fortiGate 100E at Head Office and 15 fortiGate 60E located at the Provincial/ District offices. The line capacities range from 4Mbps to 10Mbps for all the sites with central 20Mbps internet breakout. The District Offices are currently connected to the MPSL network via IPSEC and the three Provincial offices are connecting with the LTE. NDA has a e VoIP solution running on a separate link, however there is an interconnectivity between the current internet service and the VoIP service.

#### 3. PURPOSE OF THE BID

The purpose of the bid is to solicit proposals from suitable service providers to render the following required services to NDA over a period of 60-months:

#### 3.1. Specifications

- Provision, support, maintenance and management of Internet Services with high availability and failover to achieve redundancy.
- Provision, support, maintenance and management of MPLS services solution with high availability and failover to achieve redundancy.
- Provide Network reports and alerts as per the NDA' requirements.
- · Bidders to respond in the following way:
  - Demonstrate both the ability and the proposed solution with respect to the element(s) concerned;
  - Demonstrate the track record with respect to the element(s) concerned;
  - Demonstrate compliance with the Agency's requirement

#### 4. SCOPE OF WORK

The provision, configuration and maintenance of MPLS (last mile included) and Internet Services solution to all NDA offices over a period of 60-Months. The minimum specifications for the provision of MPLS and Internet Service solution at Head Office, Provincial offices and District offices are as follows:

#### 4.1. Head Office and Provincial Offices Connection MPLS requirements

#### 4.1.1. Primary Connection

- 40 Mbps (fibre) in Head Office
- 10 Mbps (fibre) per Provincial Office, with an exception of KZN Provincial office with a 20 Mbps (fibre)
- 10 Mbps (fibre) per District Office

## 4.1.2. *Failover and high availability* Minimum Specifications (Secondary Connection)

- 4 Mbps (Microwave Network) in Head Office
- 2 Mbps (Microwave Network) in Head Office
- 250 GB (LTE) per Provincial Office
- 250 GB LTE per District Office

#### 4.1.3. Connection Specification

- The service provider must provide Cisco routers.
- The service provider must provide minimum 10 public IP addresses.

#### 4.2. Internet Requirements

- 4.2.1. *Provision of internet services of 80Mbps Primary* (50:50 Split between Local and International traffic):
- 4.2.2. **Provision of internet services of 40Mbps Secondary** (50:50 Split between Local and International traffic)

#### 4.3. Service Management Requirements:

- 4.3.1. Provision of a report portal that will be accessible to the NDA. (Portal example to be attached)
- 4.3.2. Provision of scheduled utilization reports with graphs and a tool for monitoring of link quality and bandwidth utilization (sample of report to be attached)
- 4.3.3. Provision of automated network status alerts.
- 4.3.4. Voice and video to run across the same network (written confirmation).
- 4.3.5. The solution must be able easily scalable in accordance with NDA's future requirements (indicate how the solution can be scalable)
- 4.3.6. The solution should provide NDA with a secure, private network that is configured to provide network reliability, scalability, manageability and availability (indicate security features of the solution)
- 4.3.7. Provision of 24x7 support services (provide call centre contact numbers and operating hours).
- 4.3.8. Entering into a Service Level Agreement that defines parameters of rebates for non-performance, etc. (penalty formula)
- 4.3.9. The Services Provider is expected to provide 99% uptime of the service (written confirmation), supported by the failover.
- 4.3.10. The Services Provider should provide dedicated support technical team for all technical issues, with defined call logging procedure (details of the technical team including roles and responsibilities).

#### 4.4. Quality of Service

4.4.1. The winning bidder will be required to implement the QoS. The service provider must provide a detailed QoS proposal plan, which includes but is not limited to

distribution of bandwidth voice, data, video, network traffic management approach.

#### 4.5. Adhoc Services

- 4.5.1. Demonstrate the ability, track record and compliance to the specifications.
- 4.5.2. The Ad Hoc Services will not exceed 15% of the Contract Value for the contract period. Both the NDA and the successful bidder will be required to keep account of the Ad Hoc Services and the costs thereof such that the specified variation percentage is not exceeded. Bidder to demonstrate the ability to perform and report on this task;
- 4.5.3. All Service Requests requirements will be classified as Ad Hoc Services, except for the Change Requests that result from Incident Management, Problem Management and Maintenance processes, which will be part of the baseline services. Bidder to elaborate on the ability to fulfil this requirement;
- 4.5.4. The successful bidder will invoice only on approved and completed Ad Hoc Services on one month arrear basis. Bidders to indicate acceptance with this arrangement;
- 4.5.5. Ad hoc services to be agreed in advance with the successful bidder and price list to be documented in advance.

#### 5. TECHNICAL EVALUATION (PHASE 1)

#### 5.1. Documents for Technical Evaluation

Company profile (with written references from suppliers' clients, detailing the nature of work done, duration of contract). The references should be on the referee's official letter-head with full contact details and designation of the person signing the reference letter.

#### 5.3. Clarification of the above Score System

• Internet solution and MPLS solution presented clearly on the network diagram (NB: A3 PRINTOUT) = Total of 40 points

Failure to present the required network diagram in A3 size format will result in a score of zero (0) points.

Service providers should have the requirements detailed in section 4.1 and 4.2 of this document to get the full forty (40) points.

#### Service Management Requirements = Total of 30 points

A total of three (3) points per line item will be allocated. This will be in line with evidence submitted. Failure to submit evidence will result in points being lost. Only a full three (3) points or zero will be allocated per item.

#### Quality of Service = Total of 10 points

Service Providers must submit a <u>clear</u> and detailed QoS proposal plan in line with the requirements detailed in 4.4 of this document. Service providers who submit a plan which does not address the minimum requirements in section 4.4 will score zero (0) points.

#### Service Take-on = Total of 10 points

The service providers must provide a detailed work plan with activities, timelines and deliverables within the scope of work on how to take over the current services from the current service provider with minimum interruptions of NDA's operation.

#### • Experience = Total of 10 points

Service Providers must submit their experience documented in a maximum of 2 pages, highlighting their experience in line with our requirements. Full 4 points will be allocated to a service provider with eight (8) years and above. Only full four points will be allocated for eight (8) years experience and above and zero for providers with less than eight (8) years experience.

Two (2) points will be allocated per reference letter submitted.

**Note:** Only one copy of the bid document is required by the NDA. Service providers must keep their own copy of the bid document submitted to the NDA as no copies will be made for any service provider by the NDA.

#### 6. COMMERCIAL EVALUATION (PHASE 2)

6.1 Bids will be evaluated in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017, using the 80/20 preference points system as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA, Act 5 of 2000). The lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points for price and maximum of 20 points will be awarded for attaining the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status level of contribution.

- 6.2 The bid proposals received will be evaluated in two (2) phases. On the first phase bids will be evaluated on functionality and on the second phase in accordance with the 80/20 preference points system respectively.
- 6.3 Bid proposal must score a minimum of eighty (80) points or more out of hundred (100) points on functionality in order to qualify for advancement to the next phase of evaluation. Second phase, a bid proposal scoring less than 80 out of 100 will not be considered for further evaluation and will be disqualified.
- Phase two: During this phase, bid proposals that passed the first phase will be further evaluated based on the 80/20 preference points system in accordance with the PPPFA Act, where 80 points will be attained in respect of price (the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points and bidders that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis) and 20 points will be awarded for attaining the Broad-Based Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

- In order to claim the B-BBEE Status Level of Contributor, bidders must submit Sworn Affidavits or original and valid B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificates or certified copies thereof, issued by accredited Verification Agencies such as SANAS or Registered Auditor approved by the IRBA together with their bids, to substantiate their B-BBEE claims. Exempted Micro Enterprises must submit a letter from the Accounting Officer who is appointed in terms of the Close Corporation Act.
- 6.6 Bidders who do not submit B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificate or are non-compliant contributors to B-BBEE do not qualify for preference points for B-BBEE, but will not be disqualified from the bidding process. They will score points out of 80 for price only and zero (0) points out of 20 for B-BBEE.

- 6.7 Bidders are requested to complete the preference claim form (SBD 6.1) in order to claim preference points.
- 6.8 A tender will be awarded to the tenderer who scored the highest total number of points in terms of the preference point systems (price and B-BBEE points). It should be noted that the NDA reserves the right not to appoint any service provider and no service provider will be reimbursed for any costs incurred whilst participating in this bid.

#### 7. PRICING

- 7.1.1 Service providers must submit a detailed cost breakdown for all applicable costs e.g. Initial setup costs, monthly costs, and any other applicable costs. All prices submitted must be inclusive of VAT
- 7.1.1. Service providers must indicate if their prices will be fixed and firm for the duration of the proposed contract period, if not, the proposed escalations should be clearly indicated.
- 7.1.2. Service Providers must ensure that the quotes submitted have no arithmetic errors as NDA will not rectify any errors and no adjustments to quotations received will be permitted.
- 7.1.3. Service providers will carry the responsibility of ensuring that the proposals submitted have been signed by a dully authorised person. Should it be established after the submission of proposals that the signatory authorising the proposal is not legally appointed by the service provider, the offer/proposal will be disqualified from the evaluation process.
- 7.1.4. All prices submitted should be typed in black ink or written in pen, proposals written in pencil will not be accepted and evaluated.
- 7.1.5. A two envelope system will be used for the submission of proposals.

#### 8. TENDER VALIDITY

All submitted bids must be valid for 150-days from the closing date of this bid.

#### 9. NDA PAYMENT TERMS

Invoices will be paid 30-days from the date of submission and approval.

#### 10. MANDATORY DOCUMENTS

- 10.1 Valid Tax Clearance Certificate issued by the South African Revenue Services (SARS). Where consortium/joint ventures/sub-contractor are involved each party to the association must submit a separate valid original Tax Clearance Certificate or SARS tax Pin and a CSD report.
- 10.2 Company registration documents (CIPC).
- 10.3 A letter/resolution authorising the person signing the bid documents and contracts.
- 10.4 All participating Service Providers must complete, sign and return ALL the attached SBD forms (SBD1, SBD2, SBD4, SBD6.1 SBD 6.2, SBD8 and SBD9) declaration forms, together with their proposals. Failure to complete and submit any of the attached documents will result in immediate disqualification.
- 10.5 Service providers to make sure that they are registered on the SITA transversal contract RFB 1183/2013, for the following ICT service:

#### 11. CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE

The NDA will not appoint any supplier who is not registered as a prospective supplier on the central supplier database as required in terms of National Treasury Circular No. 3 of 2015/2016 and National Treasury SCM Instruction note 4 of 2016/2017

#### 12. CONTRACT AWARD

A binding contract will be signed after both parties have fully agreed to the scope of work and all terms and conditions. The NDA legal department will develop a draft contract that shall be used as basis to finalise contract terms and conditions.

#### 13. DISCLAIMER

- 13.1 Whilst all due care has been taken in connection with the preparation of this bid, the NDA makes no representations or warranties that the content in this bid or any information communicated to or provided to bidders during the bidding process is, or will be, accurate, current or complete. The NDA, and its officers and employees will not be liable with respect to any information communicated which is not accurate, current or complete.
- 13.2 If a bidder finds or reasonably believes it has found any discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in the bid or any other information provided by the NDA (other than minor clerical matters), the bidder must promptly notify NDA in writing of such discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in order to afford the NDA an opportunity to consider what corrective action is necessary (if any).
- 13.3 Any actual discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in this bid or any other information provided by the NDA will, if possible, be corrected and provided to all bidders without attribution to the bidder who provided the written notice.
- 13.4 No representations made by or on behalf of NDA in relation to this bid will be binding on the NDA unless that representation is expressly incorporated into the contract ultimately entered into between NDA and the successful bidder.

#### 14. ADDITIONS AND AMENDMENTS TO THE BID

- 1.3. THIS BID IS SUBJECT TO THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT POLICY FRAMEWORK ACT, 2000 AND THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT REGULATIONS, 2017, THE GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (GCC) AND, IF APPLICABLE, ANY OTHER SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

#### CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids<sup>1</sup> invited.
- Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).<sup>2</sup> Collusive bidding is a pe se prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.
- Treasury Regulation 16A9 prescribes that accounting officers and accounting authorities must take all reasonable steps to prevent abuse of the supply chain management system and authorizes accounting officers and accounting authorities to:
