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1. OVERVIEW OF NDA

- 1.1 The National Development Agency (NDA) reports to Parliament through the Department of Social Development. The NDA is classified as a public entity under schedule 3A of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999), and was established in November 1998 by the National Development Act, 1998 (Act No. 108 of 1998) (NDA Act) as government's response to the challenge of poverty and its causes in South Africa.
- 1.2 The NDA derives its mandate from the National Development Agency Act, 1988 (Act No. 108 of 1998). In terms of the Act, the primary objective of the NDA is to contribute towards the eradication of poverty and its causes by granting funds to CSOs for the purposes of:
 - (a) carrying out projects or programmes aimed at meeting the development needs of poor communities; and
 - (b) strengthening the institutional capacity of other CSOs involved in direct service provision to poor communities.
- 1.3 The secondary objects of the NDA in terms of the Act are-
 - (a) to promote-
 - (i) consultation, dialogue and sharing of development experience between CSOs and relevant organs of State; and
 - (ii) debate on policy development
 - (b) to undertake research and publication aimed at providing the basis for development policy.
- 1.4 The NDA plays a critical role in contributing towards shifting the country from the scourge of poverty towards poverty eradication. Through the Act and various policies, the NDA contributes to but is not limited to the advancement of economic development, social cohesion, access to basic human rights and skills development. This contribution of the NDA supports the National Development Plan (NDP) 2030 outcomes for a greater and better South Africa.

1.5 The National Development Plan (NDP), the Medium-Term Strategic Framework (MTSF), Sector Plans and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) guide the NDA's functions. The aim of the NDP is in line with the NDA's mandate. The NDP aims to reduce inequality and eliminate poverty by 2030.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 The NDA is a Microsoft based environment with 200 employees and has 43 virtual servers, 4 physical servers (x3 VMWare 6.7 and x1 windows). The ICT environment has the following key networking device: switches (FortiSwitch 224D) and Fortinet firewalls. The NDA has three cloud services (Mimecast, Office 365, and Azure) and centralised data centre with one recovery site.

3. PURPOSE AND RATIONALE OF THE BID

3.1 The purpose of this bid is to appoint service provider from potential bidder (s) to perform a cybersecurity risk assessment, identify gaps, and develop an ICT Security Strategy and implementation plan for the NDA.

4. SCOPE OF WORK

The NDA would like to adopt an integrated approach to information security and build a capability in a sustainable manner, hence the scope requires a holistic approach from cybersecurity risk assessment, identify gaps, develop an ICT Security Strategy and an implementation plan.

The scope of the project should include, but not limited to the following:

4.1 ICT / Cybersecurity risk assessment

- 4.1.1 The bidder should conduct a comprehensive vulnerability assessment to the entire ICT infrastructure and not be limited to the stated forms of assessments:
 - Network Scanning
 - Port Scanning
 - System Identification
 - Operating System Configuration
 - Vulnerability Canning
 - Spoofing

- LAN, DMZ & WAN
- Wi-Fi Infrastructure
- Firewall Rules Review
- Denial Of Service Attacks
- Server Infrastructure including Virtual servers and Network Nodes

4.1.2 Penetration Testing (White, Grey and Black Box)

The testing must be non-disruptive and nonintrusive. Any potential disruptive techniques must to be disclosed for the NDA management to determine how the testing will proceed.

The bidder should perform the pen testing using white, grey and the black box approach and cover the following but not limited to:

- Pentest of vulnerabilities identified in the NDA
- Internal environment including reporting
- Unauthenticated testing from the perspective of an attacker on the internal network including full port scanning, service enumeration and exploitation.
- External Environment including reporting Domain: www.nda.org.za and subdomains.
- Internal Networks (LAN, Wi-Fi & Remote) penetration testing.
- DMZ "demilitarized zone" Penetration testing.
- Authenticated Web Applications penetration testing.
- Social engineering attacks such as phishing and malicious USB attacks
- Remote Access for Users/Network VPN Testing.

4.2 Identify gaps

The bidder should identify gaps against the cybersecurity framework/s i.e., ISO 27001 and should use a work protected approach which includes identification of gaps on ICT Platforms, procedures, controls, data, and people as listed but not limited to:

- Critical Systems and Applications Configuration Analysis
- Physical Security review (data centre)
- Current Policy & Procedures review
- Mobile Devices
- Wireless connection

- Conduct cybersecurity response maturity assessment using applicable tools.
- Test current security controls
- All hosted services (i.e., Microsoft platforms, Mimecast etc.)

4.3 Develop an ICT Security Strategy

The bidder must develop an ICT Security Strategy containing the essential elements of the cybersecurity, but not limited to:

- Identifying the NDA's awareness of information security to effectively identify and creation of a sustainable information security governance framework (including Policy, Standards and Processes) to provide a consistent approach to managing information security risks, both internally and at key third party suppliers.
- Protecting the NDA by developing a strategy that includes additional controls to manage ICT environment and user access. Strategy to improve on effective user training and to increase overall awareness of information security risks and threats.
- Detect by proving guidance on appropriate systems, capabilities, processes, and procedures to detect information security events as early as possible.
- The ability to effectively **respond** and **recover** from any information cybersecurity incidents, to maintain effective operations across the NDA and retaining stakeholder confidence. The strategy should include plans for business resilience and to restore any key services that might be impaired by an information security event in an efficient and effective manner.
- Ensure that the strategy is underpinned by supporting proper *governance*, *policy*, and *data ownership* to provide the required control that will allow the NDA to demonstrate its consistent approach to cybersecurity and threats.

5. DELIVERABLES

The NDA is expecting to receive the following deliverable:

- 5.1 ICT / Cybersecurity Assessment Report (Inclusive of the ICT Vulnerability Test Results, Systems and Pen testing assessment).
- 5.2 Security Gap analysis report (Findings per area).
- 5.3 Revised ICT Security policy and procedures.
- 5.4 Cybersecurity response maturity results.
- 5.5 Revised and approved ICT Security Strategy with implementation plan.

6. AD HOC SERVICES (NON SCORABLE REQUIREMENTS)

6.1 The Ad Hoc services will not exceed 15% of the Contract Value for the contract period. Both the Agency and the successful bidder will be required to keep account of the Ad Hoc services and the costs thereof, such that the specified variation percentage is not exceeded.

7. Proposed Duration

- 7.1 The project to perform a cybersecurity risk assessment, identify gaps, develop an ICT. Security Strategy and an implementation plan should be completed within three (3) months post signing of an agreement.
- 7.2 Service provider(s) that are currently executing contractual assignments for the NDA on forensic audits and/or any related work, or have executed such work within the previous 6 months of the date of advertisement of this TOR will not be considered for this assignment.

9. COMMERCIAL EVALUATION (PHASE 2)

- 9.1. Bids will be evaluated in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017, using the 80/20 preference points system as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA, Act 5 of 2000). The lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points for price and a maximum of 20 points will be awarded for attaining the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status level of contribution.
- 9.2. The bid proposals received will be evaluated in two (2) phases. On the first phase, bids will be evaluated on functionality on the second phase following the 80/20 preference points system respectively.
- 9.3. Bid proposal must score a minimum of eighty (80) points or more out of a hundred (100) points on functionality to qualify for advancement to the next phase of evaluation. In the second phase, a bid proposal scoring less than 80 out of 100 will not be considered for further evaluation and will be disqualified.
- 9.4. Phase two: During this phase, bid proposals that passed the first phase will be further evaluated based on the 80/20 preference points system in accordance with the PPPFA Act, where 80 points will be attained in respect of price (the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points and bidders that quoted higher prices will score lower points for the price on a pro-rata basis) and 20 points will be awarded for attaining the Broad-Based Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status level of contribution under the table below:

- 9.5. To claim the B-BBEE Status Level of Contributor, bidders must submit Sworn Affidavits or original and valid B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificates or certified copies thereof, issued by accredited Verification Agencies such as SANAS or Registered Auditor approved by the IRBA together with their bids, to substantiate their B-BBEE claims. Exempted Micro Enterprises must submit a letter from the Accounting Officer who is appointed in terms of the Close Corporation Act.
- 9.6. Bidders who do not submit B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificate or are non-compliant contributors to B-BBEE do not qualify for preference points for B-BBEE, but will not be disqualified from the bidding process. They will score points out of 80 for price only and zero (0) points out of 20 for B-BBEE.
- 9.7. Bidders are requested to complete the preference claim form (SBD 6.1) to claim preference points.
- 9.8. A tender will be awarded to the tenderer who scored the highest total number of points in terms of the preference point systems (price and B-BBEE points). It should be noted that the NDA reserves the right not to appoint any bidder and no bidder will be reimbursed for any costs incurred whilst participating in this bid.

10. JOINT VENTURES, CONSORTIUMS AND TRUSTS

A trust, consortium or joint venture, will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.

A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity if the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were

a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.

Bidders must submit concrete proof of the existence of joint ventures and/or consortium arrangements. The NDA will accept signed agreements as acceptable proof of the existence of a joint venture and/or consortium arrangement.

When bidding through a Joint Venture, the Joint Ventures must submit a Consolidated B-BBEE certificate if it is not an incorporated entity when responding to tenders. This means that the bidder will have to obtain a new B-BBEE certificate for the Joint Venture, which consolidates each participant's B-BBEE status level.

11. SUB-CONTRACTING

Bidders/ tenderers who want to claim Preference points will have to fully comply with regulation 5 and 12(3) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations 2017 about subcontracting which states that:

- "(5) A tenderer may not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level of contributor if the tender documents indicate that the tenderer intends subcontracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other person not qualifying for at least the points that the tenderer qualifies for unless the intended subcontractor is an EME that has capability to execute the subcontract.
- 12 (3) A person awarded a contract may not subcontract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level of contributor than the person concerned unless the contract is subcontracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.

12. CLIENT BASE

The NDA reserves the right to contact references during the evaluation and adjudication process to obtain information.

14. PRICING

14.1. Bidders must submit a detailed cost breakdown for all applicable costs e.g. Initial setup costs, monthly costs, and any other applicable costs. All prices submitted must be inclusive of VAT.

14.2. Bidders must indicate if their prices will be fixed and firm for the duration of the proposed contract period, if not, the proposed escalations should be indicated.

- 14.3. Bidders must ensure that the quotes submitted have no arithmetic errors as NDA will not rectify any errors and no adjustments to quotations received will be permitted.
- 14.4. Bidders will carry the responsibility of ensuring that the proposals submitted have been signed by a duly authorised person. Should it be established after the submission of proposals that the signatory authorising the proposal is not legally appointed by the service provider, the offer/proposal will be disqualified from the evaluation process.
- 14.5. All prices submitted should be typed in black ink or written in pen, proposals written in pencil will not be accepted and evaluated.
- 14.6. A two-envelope system will be used for the submission of proposals.

15. TENDER VALIDITY

All submitted bids must be valid for 150-days from the closing date of this bid.

16. NDA PAYMENT TERMS

Invoices will be paid 30-days from the date of submission and approval.

17. MANDATORY DOCUMENTS

- 17.1Tax Clearance Certificate issued by the South African Revenue Services
- (SARS) or SARS Pin or CSD Report. Where consortium/joint ventures/sub-contractor are involved each party to the association must submit a separate valid original Tax Clearance Certificate or SARS tax Pin or a CSD report. Alternatively, service providers must fully complete Standard Bid Document 1 (SBD 1) to give effect to the tax compliance status system.
- 17.2 Signed agreements for joint ventures and/or consortium arrangements.
- 17.3. Company registration documents with the relevant authority (CIPC).
- 17.4. A letter/resolution authorising the person signing the bid documents and contracts.
- 17.5. All participating bidders must complete, sign and return (SBD1, 3.3,4 and 6.1) attached together with their proposals.

17.6 Bidders must submit a detailed cost breakdown for all applicable costs e.g. Initial setup costs, monthly costs, and any other applicable costs. All prices submitted must be inclusive of VAT.

Failure to complete and submit any of the attached documents will result in immediate disqualification.

18. CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE

18.1. The NDA will not appoint any supplier who is not registered as a prospective supplier on the central supplier database as required in terms of National Treasury Circular No. 3 of 2015/2016 and National Treasury SCM Instruction note 4 of 2016/2017.

19. CONTRACT AWARD

A binding contract will be signed after both parties have fully agreed to the scope of work and all terms and conditions. The NDA legal department will develop a draft contract that shall be used as the basis to finalise contract terms and conditions.

20. DISCLAIMER

20.1. Whilst all due care has been taken in connection with the preparation of this bid, the NDA makes no representations or warranties that the content in this bid or any information communicated to or provided to bidders during the bidding process is, or will be, accurate, current or complete. The NDA and its officers and employees will not be liable for any information communicated which is not accurate, current or complete.

20.2. If a bidder finds or reasonably believes it has found any discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in the bid or any other information provided by the NDA (other than minor clerical matters); the bidder must promptly notify NDA in writing of such discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency to allow the NDA to consider what corrective action is necessary (if any).

20.3. Any actual discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in this bid or any other information provided by the NDA will, if possible, be corrected and provided to all bidders without attribution to the bidder who provided the written notice.

20.4. No representations made by or on behalf of NDA about this bid will be binding on the NDA unless that representation is expressly incorporated into the contract ultimately entered into between NDA and the successful bidder.

24. SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF THIS BID
