1. Introduction

The NDA derives its mandate from the National Development Act No. 108 of 1998, as amended, to contribute towards eradication of poverty and its causes by granting funds to civil society organisations (CSOs) and strengthening the capabilities of civil society organisations involved in direct service provision to poor communities. The Act also states on its secondary mandate that the objects of the NDA promotes:

- i) Consultation, dialogue and sharing of development experience between civil society organisation and relevant organs of state,
- ii) Debate on development policy and to undertake research and publication aimed at providing the bases for development policy

The NDA also contributes towards poverty eradication and its causes by granting funds to civil society organizations (CSOs) to implement development projects in poor communities and to strengthen the institutional capacity of CSOs that provide services to poor communities.

The Department of Social Development (DSD) is mandated to deliver welfare services in line with the Governments Strategic priorities as well as legislative frameworks and policies. One of the legislative frameworks is the Policy on Financial award to Service providers. This Policy responds to the financial need of civil society organizations to provide statutory services to society. The Policy aims to finance service providers and civil society organization (CSO') in the social development sector. Since 2007, the DSD, through the Victim Empowerment Directorate has been receiving the Criminal Asset Recovery Account (CARA) Funding in three-year cycles. The objective of the CARA DSD funding is to strengthen CSO's and shelters within the Victim Empowerment Sector. The DSD is further responsible for reporting on VEP and GBV implementation to the Integrated Justice System Development Committee (IJS DevCom), which is the Sub-committee of the Justice, Crime Prevention and Security Cluster (JCPS)

The advent of COVID-19 in South Africa in 2020 has seen the increase in gender violence and femicide in making quotas of South African Communities. The Interim Steering Committee on Gender-Based Violence and Femicide is tasked with the responsibility to coordinate the implementation of the Emergency Response Action Plan (ERAP). The Department of Social Development (DSD) as a lead Department for the Victim Empowerment Programme (VEP) was requested to combine the CARA funds with the funding from the ERAP to increase their strengthening capacity to Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) that provide services to survivors and victims of Gender-Based Violence (GBV).

In 2019, the National DSD (NDSD) appointed the NDA to implement the Criminal Asset Recovery Account (CARA) for the period of 24 months. It is to this end that the NDSD has entered into the Memorandum of Understanding with the NDA to disburse funds to the CSO

offering services to GBV victims and communities. The NDA and the DSD intend to conduct an implementation evaluation study of the CARA fund to the gender-based violence and femicide programme. This is a formative assessment that seeks to ascertain the extent to which the funding agreement between the DSD and NDA as well as the extent to which the CSOs appointed by the NDA are implementing the CARA funded programmes as defined by the Social Development and the GBV&F Interim Steering Committee.

2. Background

The 2019 Memorandum of Agreement entered by the National Department of Social Development required the NDA to be implementing partner and facilitate the funding of CSO that will implement the CARA programme. The programme was meant for the identification and appointment of CSOs that operate in the following areas that are critical in the successful implementation of the VEP and GBV:

- Lobby Access to justice for victims and survivors to date, the criminal justice system has been inadequate in responding to the crisis of rape, domestic violence, femicide, child homicide and related forms of gender-based violence in South Africa.
- Change norms and behaviour through high-level prevention efforts taking immediate steps to influence and change norms and behaviour is critical towards stopping GBV from occurring while sending out a firm message to all in South Africa that violence against women and children cannot be tolerated, as it violates Constitutional rights.
- Urgently Respond to Victims and Survivors of GBV survivors of gender-based violence have continued to face the secondary trauma of not being able to access the necessary support and justice, as an additional violation of their human dignity. A key principle underlying an effective response to gender-based violence is that the rights and needs of survivors are paramount. Access to respectful and supportive services that guarantees confidentiality, safety and survivor agency is also critical.
- Strengthen accountability and architecture to adequately respond to the scourge of gender-based violence and femicide - the multi-sectoral model agreed by government and civil society calls for holistic inter-organisational and inter-agency cooperation and collaboration and active participation by people affected by genderbased violence and femicide.

When the Covid-19 broke out in South Africa in 2020 the NDA was already in the process of implementing the first phase of CARA programme. The CSOs had to revise the implementation plans to align with the effects the Covid-19 had caused to the programme The revision of the implementation plans took place because the CSO's applied for more funding that the amount to be disbursed) I suggest you remove this part.

In doing so the NDA has been required, amongst others; Activities, to:

- Conduct physical verification of recommended CSOs.
- Evaluate and recommend CSOs that qualifies for funding.
- Monitor programme implementation by funded CSOs.

The programme was designed to have 330 CSOs, of which 30% should be emerging CSOs from identified communities. The project is designed to run for 24 months, commencing in March 2020 until February 2022.

These provinces have a combined total of 314 CSOs identified and contracted to be involved in the CARA programme.

By the end of December 2020, the NDA managed to implement the CARA programme whereby the Department of Social Development had transferred R 95 million for funding of 169 CSOs evaluated by the NDA.

Among the key outcomes expected from this CARA programme as implemented by the CSO's would be the improved access to services for GBV survivors including the following:

- A better-informed public about the rights and responsibilities through public education campaigns around survivor's rights (women, children and LGBTQI+ persons) under the law, challenging the use and acceptability of GBV, patriarchy and related forms of discrimination and inequalities;
- Improved access to care, support and prevention services and interventions through strengthened support for those involved in response and prevention, including civil society stakeholders;
- Strengthened accountability and architecture to adequately respond to the scourge of GBV; and
- Increased access to economic opportunities that set out to meaningfully address women's social and economic vulnerability.

3. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE EVALUATION STUDY

The aims of this study is threefold;

- 1. Evaluate the extent to which the contract between DSD and NDA was implemented in terms of:
 - Financial disbursements

- ii. Submission of reports
- iii. Establishment of Governance structures and their functioning
- iv. The appropriateness of the partnership between the NDA and DSD in implementing the CARA programme to CSO's
- 2. Evaluate and examine the process to which the NDA appointed CSOs
 - Assess and evaluate the processes used by the NDA in the selection, appointment and management of the organisations to provide the GBVF services for the CARA programme;
 - ii. Assess and evaluate the management, coordination and reporting systems by the NDA in the implementation of the programme
 - iii. Assess and evaluate the capacities of the appointed CSOs on delivering the GBV services in the areas they are servicing;
- 3. Assess the extent to which the appointed CSO's implemented their CARA funded GBVF projects
 - i. Measure and evaluate the quality and quantity of services the CSOs been delivered with the CARA funds on the range of interventions they provided to communities:
 - ii. Assess the extent to which this VEP CARA funded project is contributing to the goal of the National Strategic Plan on Gender-Based Violence of ending genderbased violence and femicide.
- 4. Recommendations on how the CARA programme can be improved.

4. PROPOSAL METHODOLOGY

The methodology proposed by prospective evaluators interested in conducting this evaluation must be cognisance of the current COVID-19 regulations and restrictions, especially where primary data would need to be collected from subjects through interviews. Notwithstanding the COVID period, the methodology proposed must be robust and comprehensive to meet the objectives stated above, in the following:

- Representative sample (sample size) of the organisations(CSO's) currently implementing the CARA programme across all nine (9) provinces
- A representative sample of respondents for interviews, records, key informants etc, across all NDA and DSD Officials identified to participate in this evaluation
- Robust interview schedules, guides designed and developed for evaluating the programme;
- Robust data collection, data capture and data analysis to be used in the evaluation of this programme, including data triangulation where would be appropriate.

The study must review all available documents produced that are relevant to the programme. These documents include the DSD & NDA contract, TOR for governance structures and the minutes of their meetings, Project documents; concept documents, CSO contracts with NDA; documents used during selection of the CSO to deliver the programme; CARA progress reports submitted by the CSOs to the NDA, CARA progress reports submitted by NDA to DSD, NDA Templates used for reporting (all provinces); Monitoring reports; Average duration of contracts between CSO's and NDA, Statistical reports on compliance of CSO's to their contract; Turnaround time between the signing of the contract and payment; National NDA reports to the National Department of Social Development(both Progress and Financial). Provincial monitoring reports. Evaluators must analyse the reports to evaluate the performance of the CSO's in delivering the programme funded by CARA as well as the performance of NDA to disburse funds to CSO's. Information to be analysed should include the relevance of the funded programme to contributing to GBVF. The document review will also be used to ascertain how the funded CSOs are being mentored and the levels in which they were assisted in handling the community cases related to GBV.

5. SCOPE OF WORK

The evaluation study covers NDA's involvement in the CARA project managed by the DSD and the CSO involvement in CARA interventions since their appointments by the NDA. The Study must also cover the capacity of NDA as an implementing partner for DSD; the services rendered by both established and emerging CSO as stipulated in their service level agreements.

The evaluation will use the contractual agreement between DSD and NDA, documentation of the governance structures for the project (e.g Project Steering Committee;) project funding

These will include the funding agreements, proposals and intervention performance reports generated by CSO managers. The study will further collect primary data through interviews from selected projects. The information-gathering of the study will cover information key informants such as NDA Development Officials, DSD Provincial Coordinators in the areas of implementation and relevant DSD and NDA Officials at the national level. The scope of this evaluation study will cover the key areas of the CARA funding; operations, including processes and systems supporting operations of the programme.

- i) A review of the Contract between DSD and NDA; documents from the Governance structure formed specifically for CARA fund, Reports submitted by NDA to DSD,
- ii) Document review and evaluative analysis of the CARA programme implemented by the CSOs, which include concept documents and funding proposals), reports and any other documents that would be relevant for assessment and benchmarking similar interventions as implemented elsewhere in the country and the world.
- iii) Review and analyse data captured during the implementation of the programme, capture and code information collected that is on a paper format for purposes of analysing the data for the evaluation.
- iv) Collect primary data from people that were involved in designing and implementing the CARA programme.
- v) Evaluate and report on the entire processes of the programme design, implementation, monitoring and reporting of the CARA programmes against best practices of similar programmes.
- vi) Conduct cost-benefit analysis of the CARA programme and value in relation to responding to GBV.
- vii) Produce a detailed evaluation report with lessons from the current implementation and recommendations to NDA and DSD on how to improve the CARA programme
- viii) Present report to the NDA and DSD on all phases of the evaluation (design, implementation, draft findings reports on lessons and recommendations of the evaluation).

6. DELIVERABLES

- i. Inception Report detailing the Implementation Plan that will guide the implementation of the Evaluation Study to the CARA Evaluation Steering Committee for the attention of the NDA, Monitoring and Evaluation Unit.
- ii. Literature Review and a Theory of change workshop with Stakeholders: Submission of literature review and a conduct a workshop to develop a Theory of Change
- iii. **Design Report**: Submission of design report/report structure and evaluation method matrix, analysis plan, detailed methodology, final data collection instruments
- iv. **Fieldwork report**: Submission and presentation of a fieldwork report to the CARA Evaluation Project Steering Committee)
- v. **Draft preliminary evaluation report**: Submission of the draft evaluation report and presentation to the CARA Evaluation Project Steering Committee)
- vi. Presentation of a revised draft evaluation report in a validation workshop with stakeholders
- vii. **Final Report**: Submission of approved final evaluation reports both full and short report in 1/5/25 format including all datasets and data collection documentation (including interviews) and PowerPoint or audio-visual presentation of the results (hard copies and electronic versions)

viii. Project closure meeting

7. PROJECT TIME FRAME

- i. The project must be completed within 06 months from the date of appointment and signing of the contract.
- ii. A detailed implementation work plan detailing activities and duration should be provided.
- iii. Progress will be monitored based on the work plan and timeframes provided by the service provider.

9. COMMERCIAL EVALUATION (PHASE 2)

9.1. Bids will be evaluated in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017, using the 80/20 preference points system as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA, Act 5 of 2000). The lowest acceptable bid

- will score 80 points for price and maximum of 20 points will be awarded for attaining the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status level of contribution.
- 9.2. The bid proposals received will be evaluated in two (2) phases. On the first phase bids will be evaluated on functionality and on the second phase in accordance with the 80/20 preference points system respectively.
- 9.3. Bid proposal must score a minimum of seventy (70) points or more out of hundred (100) points on functionality in order to qualify for advancement to the next phase of evaluation. Second phase, a bid proposal scoring less than 70 out of 100 will not be considered for further evaluation and will be disqualified.
- 9.4. Phase two: During this phase, bid proposals that passed the first phase will be further evaluated based on the 80/20 preference points system in accordance with the PPPFA Act, where 80 points will be attained in respect of price (the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points and bidders that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis) and 20 points will be awarded for attaining the Broad-Based Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

9.5. In order to claim the B-BBEE Status Level of Contributor, bidders must submit Sworn Affidavits or original and valid B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificates or certified copies thereof, issued by accredited Verification Agencies such as SANAS or Registered Auditor approved by the IRBA together with their bids, to substantiate their B-BBEE

- claims. Exempted Micro Enterprises must submit a letter from the Accounting Officer who is appointed in terms of the Close Corporation Act.
- 9.6. Bidders who do not submit B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificate or are non-compliant contributors to B-BBEE do not qualify for preference points for B-BBEE, but will not be disqualified from the bidding process. They will score points out of 80 for price only and zero (0) points out of 20 for B-BBEE.
- 9.7. Bidders are requested to complete the preference claim form (SBD 6.1) in order to claim preference points.
- 9.8. A tender will be awarded to the tenderer who scored the highest total number of points in terms of the preference point systems (price and B-BBEE points). It should be noted that the NDA reserves the right not to appoint any bidder and no bidder will be reimbursed for any costs incurred whilst participating in this bid.

10. PRICING

- a. Bidders must submit a detailed cost breakdown for all applicable costs e.g.
 Initial setup costs, monthly costs, and any other applicable costs. All prices submitted must be inclusive of VAT
- b. Bidders must indicate if their prices will be fixed and firm for the duration of the proposed contract period, if not, the proposed escalations should be clearly indicated.
- c. Bidders must ensure that the quotes submitted have no arithmetic errors as NDA will not rectify any errors and no adjustments to quotations received will be permitted.
- d. Bidders will carry the responsibility of ensuring that the proposals submitted have been signed by a duly authorised person. Should it be established after the submission of proposals that the signatory authorising the proposal is not legally appointed by the service provider, the offer/proposal will be disqualified from the evaluation process.
- e. All prices submitted should be typed in black ink or written in pen, proposals written in pencil will not be accepted and evaluated.

11. TENDER VALIDITY

All submitted bids must be valid for 150-days from the closing date of this bid.

12. NDA PAYMENT TERMS

Invoices will be paid 30-days from the date of submission and approval.

13. MANDATORY DOCUMENTS

- i) Valid Tax Clearance Certificate issued by the South African Revenue Services (SARS). Where consortium/joint ventures/sub-contractor are involved each party to the association must submit a separate valid original Tax Clearance Certificate or SARS tax Pin or a CSD report.
- ii) Company registration documents (CIPC).
- iii) A letter/resolution authorising the person signing the bid documents and contracts.
- iv) All participating bidders must complete, sign and return ALL the attached SBD forms (SBD1, SBD2, SBD4, SBD6.1 SBD 3.1 and relevant Annexure, SBD8 and SBD9) declaration forms, together with their proposals
- v) ANNEXURE A (Attached)

Failure to complete and submit any of the attached documents will result in immediate disqualification.

14. CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE

a. The NDA will not appoint any supplier who is not registered as a prospective supplier on the central supplier database as required in terms of National Treasury Circular No. 3 of 2015/2016 and National Treasury SCM Instruction note 4 of 2016/2017

15. CONTRACT AWARD

A binding contract will be signed after both parties have fully agreed to the scope of work and all terms and conditions. The NDA legal department will develop a draft contract that shall be used as the basis to finalise contract terms and conditions.
